**DRUMMOND KIWANIS** hosted the Granite County Commissioners Candidate Forum at the Drummond School & Community Library. The event was livestreamed.


## DIVISION 3 BUTTE KIWANIS

**KIWANIS CLUB OF DILLON** cooked burgers, brats and hot dogs for the Fall Festival.




## DIVISION 3 SUNRISE KIWANIS, BUTTE

**CUSTER COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL KEY CLUB** went out to Trick or Treating for Unicef!




**MONTANA TECH CIRCLE K** provides a meal for high need families of Butte at Montana tech along with winter clothes and presents for their children. They also do various raffles.





**ST. JOE'S BUILDER CLUB** has created blankets for the Ronald McDonald House and is engaging in a cookie swap with the senior center.

Each Scholarship Sponsors will be providing a \$50 discount for a student that submit a 100+ word essay explaining why they want to go to camp OR go back to camp. We are capping at (20) total scholarships this year, so we're looking for **FOUR** sponsors at \$250/each.

### BUS SPONSORS

The bus is one of our **BIGGEST** expenses each year, but it's required if we want to get kids to/ from camp in a safe and efficient manner. The bus has historically cost around \$4000-\$5000 each year, so we're looking for **FIVE** sponsors at \$500/each to cover half the cost.
